MSCA - Introduction

- Grants for researchers at all stages of their careers be they doctoral candidates or highly experienced researchers
- Encourage international, intersectoral (academic/non-academic) and interdisciplinary mobility ("3i")
- Aim to equip researchers with the necessary skills and international experience for a successful career, both related to R&I (management of IPR, take up and exploitation of research results, communication, standardisation, ethics, scientific writing etc.) and to management or grant searching (involvement in the organisation of network activities, entrepreneurship, management, proposal writing, task co-ordination, etc.)
- 'Bottom-up' approach: MSCA are open to all domains of research and innovation, from fundamental research to market take-up and innovation services

Types of MSCA - ITN

Research networks (ITN): support for Innovative Training Networks

ITNs support competitively selected joint research training and/or doctoral programmes, implemented by European partnerships of universities, research institutions, and non-academic organisations

The research training programmes provide **experience outside academia**, hence developing innovation and employability skills

ITNs include industrial doctorates, in which non-academic organisations have an equal role to universities in respect of the researcher's time and supervision, and joint doctoral degrees delivered by several universities

Furthermore, non-European organisations can participate as additional partners in ITNs, enabling doctoral-level candidates to gain experience outside Europe during their training

Types of MSCA - IF

Individual fellowships (IF): support for experienced researchers undertaking mobility between countries, optionally to the non-academic sector

IF support the mobility of researchers within and beyond Europe - as well as helping to attract the best foreign researchers to work in the EU

The grant usually covers two years' salary, a mobility allowance, research costs and overheads for the host institution. Individual researchers submit proposals for funding in liaison with their planned host organisation

Proposals are judged on their **research quality**, the researcher's **future career prospects**, and the **support offered** by the host organisation

Fellows can also spend part of the fellowship elsewhere in Europe if this would boost impact, and those restarting their career in Europe benefit from special eligibility conditions

Types of MSCA - RISE

International and inter-sectoral cooperation through the Research and Innovation Staff Exchanges (RISE)

RISE supports short-term mobility of research and innovation staff at all career levels, from the most junior (post-graduate) to the most senior (management), including also administrative and technical staff

It is open to partnerships of universities, research institutions, and non-academic organisations both within and beyond Europe

In worldwide partnerships, academia-to-academia exchanges are permitted

Types of MSCA - COFUND

Co-funding of regional, national and international programmes that finance fellowships involving mobility to or from another country

The MSCA offer additional funding to regional, national and international programmes for research training and career development

COFUND programmes encourage the movement of researchers across borders and provide good working conditions

The scheme can support doctoral and fellowship programmes

Types of MSCA - NIGHT


The European Researchers' Night (NIGHT)

It is a Europe-wide public event to stimulate interest in research careers, especially among young people

The activities are focused on the general public and might take various forms such as hands-on experiments, science shows, debates, competitions or quizzes

The NIGHT takes place yearly, typically on the last Friday of the month of September

Individual fellowships (IF)

Goal of Individual Fellowships

The goal of the Individual Fellowships is to enhance the **creative and innovative potential** of **experienced researchers** wishing to diversify their individual competence in terms of **skill acquisition** through **advanced training, international and intersectoral** mobility

IF provide opportunities to acquire and transfer new knowledge and to work on research and innovation **in Europe** (EU Member States and Associated Countries) and **beyond**

It is based on an **application** made **jointly** by the **researcher** and the **beneficiary** in the academic or non-academic sectors

Types of Individual fellowships

Standard European Fellowships (EF-ST)

Mobility within Europe

Career Restart Panel (EF-CAR)

Support to individuals to resume research in Europe after a career break, e.g. after parental leave or due to recent migration

Reintegration Panel (EF-RI)

Direct return from a Third Country to a European Country thus allowing his/her long-term reintegration

Society & Enterprise Panel (EF-SE)

Research and innovation projects in an organisation from the non-academic sector

Global Fellowships (GF)

Based on a secondment to a third country and a mandatory 12 month return period to a European host

Submission of IF proposals

The proposal should be prepared by a single experienced researcher in cooperation with the applicant organisation, which is represented by the main supervisor in the framework of the proposal

Proposals can be submitted both by the researcher or by the supervisor


However, the submission of the proposal falls under the final responsibility of the applicant organisation as represented by the main supervisor

Full-time equivalent research experience is measured from the date when a researcher obtained the degree which would formally entitle him or her to embark on a doctorate

This amount is **adjusted** through the application of a **country correction coefficient** (CCC) for the cost of living according to the country in which the beneficiary is located.

The proposal – B1

Part B-1:

The **maximum** total length for this document is **10 pages**. It should be composed as follows (detailed description below):

- Section 1: Excellence

- Section 2: Impact

- Section 3: Implementation

Of the maximum 10 pages applied to sections 1, 2 and 3, applicants are free to decide on the allocation of pages between the sections. However, the overall page limit will be strictly applied: after the call deadline, excess pages will automatically be made invisible, and will not be taken into consideration by the experts.

It is the responsibility of the applicant to verify that the submitted PDF documents are readable and are within the page limit. PDF documents can contain colours.

The proposal – B2

Part B-2:

Part B-2 must contain sections 4-7 as described below. **No overall page limit** will be applied to this document, but applicants should respect the instructions given per section (e.g. in section 5, a maximum of one page should be used per beneficiary and one page per partner organisation).

- Section 4: CV of the experienced researcher (maximum length: 5 pages)
- Section 5: Capacities of the participating organisations (1 page for the overview and 1 page for each participating organisation)
- Section 6: Ethical aspects
- Section 7: Letter of commitment of the partner organisation (for GF only)

The proposal - Part B1

1. Excellence

- 1.1 Quality and credibility of the research/innovation project; level of novelty, appropriate consideration of inter/multidisciplinary and gender aspects
- 1.2 Quality and appropriateness of the training and of the two way transfer of knowledge between the researcher and the host
- 1.3 Quality of the supervision and of the integration in the team/institution
- 1.4 Potential of the researcher to reach or re-enforce professional maturity/independence during the fellowship

The proposal - Part B1

2. Impact

- 2.1 Enhancing the future career prospects of the researcher after the fellowship
- 2.2 Quality of the proposed measures to exploit and disseminate the project results
- 2.3. Quality of the proposed measures to communicate the project activities to different target audiences

The proposal - Part B1

3. Quality and Efficiency of the Implementation

- 3.1 Coherence and effectiveness of the work plan, including appropriateness of the allocation of tasks and resources
- 3.2 Appropriateness of the management structure and procedures, including risk management
- 3.3 Appropriateness of the institutional environment (infrastructure)

The proposal – Part B2

4 - CV of the experienced researcher

The CV should also include information on:

- 1. **Publications** in peer-reviewed scientific journals, peer-reviewed conference proceedings and/or monographs of their respective research fields, indicating also the number of citations (excluding self-citations) they have attracted
- 2. Granted **patent(s)**
- 3. Research **monographs**, chapters in collective volumes and any translations thereof
- 4. **Invited presentations** to internationally established conferences and/or international advanced schools
- 5. **Research expeditions** led by the experienced researcher
- 6. **Organisation of international conferences** in your field(s) of research, including membership in the steering and/or programme committee
- 7. Examples of participation in industrial innovation
- 8. Prizes and Awards
- 9. **Funding** received so far
- 10. **Supervising** and mentoring activities

The proposal – Part B2

6 - Ethical Issues

Main ethical principles:

- Respecting human dignity and integrity
- Ensuring honesty and transparency towards research subjects and notably getting free and informed consent (as well as assent whenever relevant)
- Protecting vulnerable persons
- Ensuring privacy and confidentiality
- Promoting justice and inclusiveness
- Minimising harm and maximising benefit
- Sharing the benefits with disadvantaged populations, especially if the research is being carried out in developing countries
- Maximising animal welfare, in particular by ensuring replacement, reduction and refinement ('3Rs') in animal research
- Respecting and protecting the environment and future generations






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IT fellows (nationals) grouped by country of destination (top 10 countries)



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


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
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Project distribution by scientific panel (IT)
